Concentrate on these areas of *Minuet in G* in order to understand the piece (as per the YouTube video)...

A) Chordal nature of piece - play in legato style slowly...

B) Barre & half-barre's

- Going from barre to 3<sup>rd</sup> further up fret in bars 4&5
- Moving from C chord in 1<sup>st</sup> position to  $\frac{1}{2}$  barre on the 5<sup>th</sup> fret in bar 15...

C) Final chord use 2<sup>nd</sup> finger on lower G note
